EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

As required by Section 102 (1) of the Companies Act, 2013 the following Explanatory Statement sets out the material facts relating to the Special Business mentioned in the accompanying Notice dated 11th August, 2017.

Item No. 4

Mrs. Zalak Shah [DIN:-0007903924] was appointed as an Additional Director of the Company, in the category of Independent Woman Director, by the Board of Directors in its meeting held on 11th August, 2017 pursuant to the provisions of Section 161 and 149 (1) of the Companies Act, 2013 and Articles of Association of the Company. She holds the office as such until the date of ensuing Annual General Meeting.

The Company has received notice in writing from the Member of the Company, along with the deposit of requisite amount under Section 160 of the Companies Act, 2013 proposing the candidature of said Director of the Company, signifying his intention to propose her as an Independent Woman Director of the Company.

The Company has received a declaration in writing from Mrs. Zalak Shah that she meets the criteria of Independence as provided in Sub Section (6) of Section 149 of the Act.

In the opinion of the Board she fulfills the conditions specified in the Act and Rules framed there under for appointment as Independent Director and she is an Independent of the Management. The Board also considers that her continued association would be of benefit to the Company.

A copy of the draft Letter of Appointment for Independent Director, setting out terms and conditions of her appointment, is available for inspection at the Registered/Corporate Office of the Company during business hours on any working day.

Pursuant to the Disclosure Requirements under Regulation 36 (3) the Listing Regulation, the Brief Resume of Mrs. Zalak Shah, Nature of her Expertise in specific functional areas, name of the Listed Companies in which she holds Directorship and membership of the Committees of the Board, etc., are separately annexed hereto as Annexure A.

Except Mrs. Zalak Shah herself, no other Directors or Key Managerial Personnel of the Company or their relatives are concerned or interested, financially or otherwise in this resolution set out at Item No 4.

Accordingly the Board recommends the Resolution as set out at Item No 4 of the Notice for the approval by the Members of the Company.

Item No. 5

Mr. Pradeep Chordia was reappointed as the Managing Director of the Company by the Shareholders in their 34th Annual General Meeting held on 24th September, 2016 for a period of one year w.e.f. 1st October, 2016. As such his term of appointment as the Managing Director of the Company is due to expire on 30th September, 2017.

Mr. Pradeep Chordia has successfully shouldered the responsibilities as the Managing Director of the Company. Keeping in view that Mr. Pradeep Chordia has rich and varied experience in the Industry and has been involved in the operations of the Company over a

long period of time; it would be in the interest of the Company to continue the employment of Mr. Pradeep Hukmichand Chordia as the Managing Director of the Company.

Considering the growth and future business Plans of the Company, the experience and expertise of Mr. Pradeep Chordia in the business of the Company and pursuant to the recommendation of Nomination and Remuneration Committee, the Board of Directors of the Company passed a resolution on 11th August, 2017 approving re-appointment of Mr. Pradeep Hukmichand Chordia, as Managing Director of the Company for a further period of two years with effect from 1st October, 2017 to 30th September, 2019. 

Industry Structure, Development, Opportunities and Outlook

The Company is mainly engaged in the food processing Industry which is showing remarkable growth. The Governments both Central and State are focusing on development of preservation of Agro Products and the main thrust is for processing of more and more agro cultivation.

The main revenue of the Company is from Products like Pickles and Ketchups. The said products are not the staple items in the Indian food habits and thus are low growth oriented.

The Company is diversifying their activities by coming out with some fast and running instant food items which are non seasonal in nature, which would contribute to the better performance.

With the long standing in the food industry and having its own Research and Development department and the full fledged Laboratory and Quality Control force in place, your Directors are confident that the Company can develop new product mixes.

3. TRANSFER TO RESERVES

Your Company has not proposed to transfer any amount to the General Reserve. The loss for the year of Rs.72,23,137/-is carried over to Profit and Loss Account under the heading of Reserve and Surplus.

4. DIVIDEND

As the Company has suffered a loss during the financial year 2016-17, your Directors do not recommend any dividend on the shares of the Company.

5. COMPOSITE SCHEME OF ARRANGEMENT OF AMALGAMATION AND DE-MERGER:

Considering the expansion /diversification of the business/ products, the Board of Directors of your Company in its meeting held on 3rd May, 2017approved the "Scheme of Arrangement"for Amalgamation of Pravin Foods Pvt. Ltd. (PFPL) and De-merger of an undertaking consisting of food related business includes Manufacturing units, tiny units, cold storage & Agri Tech centre, R & D/ Lab facilities, warehouse facilities, block shed of Chordia Food Park and Properties Limited (CFPPL) in to Chordia Food Poducts Limited (CFPL)

Accordingly the Company has approached BSE Limited (Bombay Stock Exchange) by submitting the draft Scheme of Arrangement to effect the above mergers. The Company's application with BSE Limited is yet to be cleared.

Once cleared by BSE Limited, it is subject to the approval of the shareholders and creditors of all the three concerned companies and is further subject to approval of Hon'ble National Company Law Tribunal (NCLT).

NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE BALANCE SHEET AS AT AND THE PROFIT & LOSS STATEMENT FOR THE YEAR ENDED ON 31ST MARCH, 2017

1. BASIS OF PREPARATION FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

- a. The Financial Statements have been prepared to comply in all material respects with the mandatory Accounting standards notified.
- b. The Company follows mercantile system of accounting and recognizes Income and Expenditure on an accrual basis except those with significant uncertainties.
- c. The accounting policies applied by the Company are consistent with those used in the previous year.
- d. Previous years figures have been regrouped to conform to the current year classification.

2. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

a. Basis for Accounting

The financial statements have been prepared and presented under the Historical Cost convention. On the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with the Accounting principles generally accepted in India and comply with the Accounting Standards prescribed in the Companies (Accounting Standards) Rules 2006, which continue to apply under section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 (the Act) read with Rule 7 of the Companies (Accounts) Rules, 2014.

b. Revenue Recognition

Revenue from sale of goods is recognized when the risks and rewards of ownership are transferred to the buyer.

c. Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statement requires estimates and assumptions to be made that affect the reported amount of Assets and Liabilities on the date of the financial statements and the reported amount of Revenues and Expenses during the reporting period. Difference between the actual results and estimated are recognized in the period in which the results are known/materialized.

d. Fixed Assets

Fixed assets are stated at their original cost of acquisition less accumulated Depreciation.

e. Depreciation

On fixed assets Depreciation has been provided in a manner that amortizes the cost of the assets over their estimated useful lives on straight line method as per the useful life prescribed under Schedule II the Companies Act, 2013.

f. Foreign Currency Transaction

- i. Transaction denomination in Foreign Currencies are normally recorded at the exchange rate prevailing at the date of transaction.
- ii. At the Balance Sheet date, monetary items denominated in Foreign Currency (such as Cash, Receivable, Payable etc.) are translated at the exchange rate prevailing on the last day of the accounting year.
- iii. The Income or Expenses on account of exchange difference either on settlement or on translation is recognized in Profit and Loss Account expect those relating to acquisition of fixed assets which are adjusted to the cost of such assets.

q. Investments

Long term investments are carried at cost less provision for diminution other than temporary, if any, in value of such investments. Current investments are carried at lower of cost and fair value.

h. Inventories

- i. Finished goods produced by the Company are carried at lower of cost and net realizable value after providing for the obsolescence if any.
- Semi Finished goods, Raw Material and Packing Material are carried at cost.

i. Borrowing Cost

Borrowing costs that are attributable to the acquisition or construction of Qualifying assets, up to the date when they are ready for their intended use or sale, are capitalized as part of the cost of acquisition. Other borrowing Costs are charged to Profit and Loss Account.

j. Taxation

Provision for current tax is made after taking into consideration benefits admissible under the provisions of Income Tax Act, 1961.

k. Provisions, Contingent Liabilities and Contingent Assets

Provisions involving substantial degree of estimation in measurement are recognized when there is a present obligation as a result of past events and it is probable that there will be an outflow of resources. Contingent Liabilities are not recognized but are disclosed in the notes. Contingent Assets are neither recognized not disclosed in the financial statements.
